# **Related Credits**

Northern Lights at CCV has two primary roles when reviewing and verifying college coursework:

- 1. Identifying any coursework that meets the criteria for related credits and entering that coursework into BFIS Quality and Credential accounts; and
- 2. Identifying any coursework that meets criteria for staff qualifications requirements set by the Child Development Division and entering coding for that coursework into BFIS Quality and Credential accounts.

**<u>Related credits</u>** are credits earned from college coursework that meet the following criteria:

- Course relates to working with children birth through grade three and their families; and
- Course content clearly falls within one or more Early Childhood Core Knowledge Areas or Afterschool Core Competencies<sup>1</sup>; and
- Credits are awarded by an appropriately accredited institution of higher education; and
- Student earned a grade of a C- or better in the course.

The Child Development Division has identified coursework requirements for certain roles in regulated child care programs. Northern Lights reviews transcripts to identify courses that meet criteria related to staff qualifications requirements and add this information to BFIS Quality and Credential accounts. The coding added to BFIS Quality and Credential accounts is as follows:

CD (child and human development)	CU (curriculum)	AD (administration)
PM (program management)	SS (staff supervision)	MA (management)
HR (human resource management)		

This document includes course names and numbers for Community College of Vermont (CCV) courses that meet the criteria for related credit. This document also includes the names of other courses that typically meet the criteria for related credit at other institutions of higher education. As indicated above, there are additional criteria that must be met for coursework to be added to BFIS Quality and Credential accounts. - Courses are grouped by Core Knowledge Area
- The upper section of each chart includes CCV course titles and numbers. The lower section includes additional course titles that meet the criteria for related credit.
- If a course meets the child care program licensing criteria for an identified coursework requirement, the code or codes are added in the "code" column. If a course does not meet any identified coursework requirements, this column is left blank
