

## **Online Anytime Trainings: Evaluation of Learning**

**Current Criterion:** “The participant’s learning is evaluated and the organization provides clear and specific evidence of successful completion of the training.”

### **How this is Assessed by Northern Lights:**

- Online Training Organization incorporates at least one assessment of participant learning into their online trainings
- Online Training Organization uses a benchmark of 80% for a passing score
- Online Training Organization allows participant to retake the training no more than three times

### **Concerns / Relevant Notes:**

1. While 80% does seem to be an industry standard for online trainings, Northern Lights has been unable to find research or evidence to indicate why this is the benchmark used for online anytime trainings.
2. To meet the criteria as related credit in Vermont, college courses must be completed with a grade of a C- or better. If we look at aligning online anytime training criteria to criteria for related credit, 70% would be a more appropriate benchmark.
3. Northern Lights does not evaluate difficulty of assignments. Some assignments are very easy and can be completed without actively engaging in the material. Other assignments ask for very specific details and may be difficult to complete if there is only one assessment at the end of a long training.
4. Limiting the number of times an individual can complete an assessment has equity and accessibility concerns. Multilingual individuals and anyone with language-based learning disabilities may need additional opportunities to complete the assessment successfully.
5. In fall 2020, Better Kid Care shifted their trainings to require an 80% score for passing, including for the Vermont Orientation Training. They use multiple assessments throughout the 9-hour training and individuals who do not meet the 80% benchmark for one section are able to review and retake that one section (they do not need to retake the training in its entirety).
6. Northern Lights is not aware of any online training organizations who have been declined due to these criteria (80% benchmark and repeating the assessment no more than 3 times).
7. Streamline Committee discussed a proposal of a 70% pass rate for assessments and no limit to the number of times an individual can retake the assessment.
