ECPDS Evaluation: Identifying Next Steps (Becky)

- There are two parts to the evaluations: Alignment and Integration; and Planning for PPD Professional Development Offerings
- Breakout rooms reflections:
 - o How is DEI intertwined with the field?
 - o Mentoring and coaching EC apprenticeship has mentoring embedded already, how can we bolster that across other areas?
 - O Pathways and integrating afterschool and CIS there are talks underway to make sure tech centers have workforce potentials and pathways for students
 - o Language around coaching how do we market coaching and mentoring/ how do we be thoughtful of messaging and how it relates to quality?

CDD Workforce Report (Janet McLaughlin and Renee Kelly)

- The three reports are CIS; Head Start; and Early Childhood & Afterschool
- Renee Kelly with 2023 Vermont Head Start Workforce Report
 - Head Start is early childhood services 'plus' it includes center-based care plus family well-being and health
 - The workforce comprises not only teaching staff but family service managers, directors, custodians, home visitors, health managers, etc.
 - Collaboration offices exist to facilitate collaboration between federal and state childhood systems of Head Start
 - Data sources:
 - 2023 Program Information Report (PIR)
 - 2022 VTHSCO Needs Assessment report
 - 2021 Vermont Early Childhood Wage and Fringe Benefit Comparability report
 - o Topic areas:
 - Workforce composition
 - Teaching staff qualifications
 - Staff turnover
 - Wages and benefits
 - Coaching, mentoring, and professional development needs
 - O Some key takeaways from this report:

- Parents of children in Head Start programs often end up joining Head Start programs as employees and teachers
- The number of assistant teachers increased between 2021-23 while all other positions decreased
- 83% of teachers meet training standards
- Staff turnover: there was a 50% increase in staff leaving in 2022-23 compared to 2021, and 25% of vacancies remained unfilled for three months
- Wages and benefits key findings: tiered path exists for those in the EC field; annual compensation is low for the VT EC workforce; and there was a prevalent concern over limited access to benefits
- Janet McLaughlin with VT EC Education and Afterschool Workforce Report
 - As of 2022 the number of individuals in regulated childcare is up from 2020, but still not to 2018 numbers
 - o Overall, family childcare numbers have steadily declined from 2018-2022
 - Two-thirds of all AHS districts rebounded slightly from 2020-22, but all districts are down compared to 2018
 - O Since 2018 there has been a steady increase in the percentage of individuals submitting degrees or credentials. The greatest increase of 23% is within family childcare home settings
 - o 32% of people in regulated childcare have associate degree or higher, and all categories are up since 2018
 - A takeaway from this report is: How do we consider equity (as distinct from parity) between regions of the state?
